

The UNICEF Connection:

We have formed an alliance with the Telangana Government and UNICEF, to develop the professional midwifery skills of nurses in the State. 26th October 2017 marked the beginning of a new era in maternal health with the launching of the professional midwifery nurse practitioner diploma course by the Honorable Health Minister Dr. C. Laxma Reddy at the Mother & Child Health Center, Karimnagar. This is an 18 months training programme, the first of its kind in the country. Telangana State has the highest CSR in the country. Research has shown, when Professional Midwives are the lead carers of women in labour and birth, there is a reduced incidence of unnecessary medical interventions and C-sections with the mothers' experience of birth being more positive.


Workshops we conducted:
